
"Approaching sensory disabilities in late medieval English literature"

Prof. Dr. Annette Kern-Stähler is Professor of Medieval English Studies at the University of Bern. An acclaimed specialist for the study of the senses in the Middle Ages, she has been co-principal investigator of several international research projects on the senses, with funding received from the Swiss National Science Foundation and the Royal Society of Edinburgh, and is co-editor of *Literature* and the Senses (Oxford: OUP, 2023, with

Elizabeth Robertson) and of *The Five Senses in Medieval and Early Modern England* (Leiden: Brill 2016, with Beatrix Busse & Wietse de Boer). Prof. Kern-Stähler is honorary professor at the University of Kent at Canterbury and has been awarded a number of important international fellowships.
