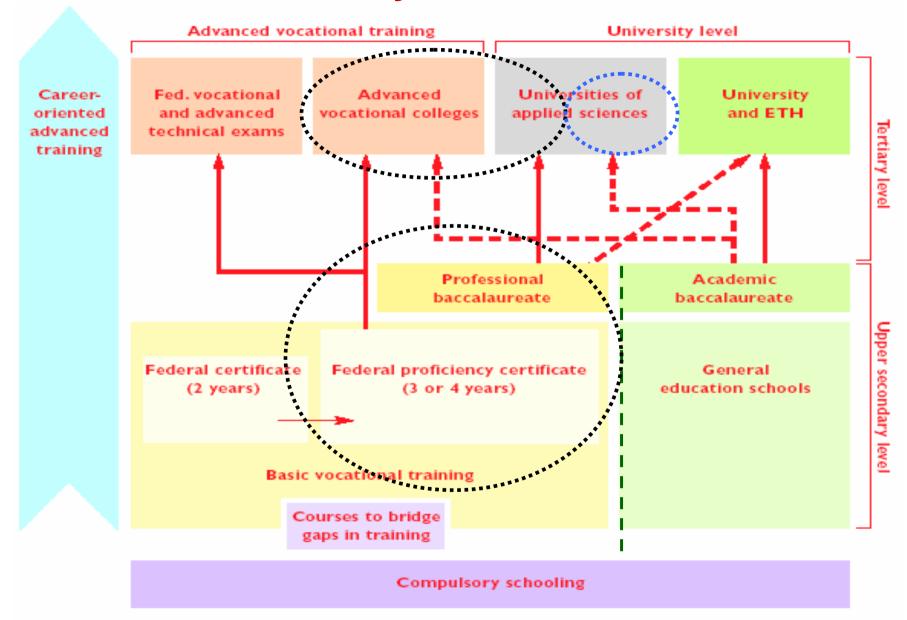

### Structure of education of young people in the year 2000

#### Final examination

- Secondary II: 82%; tertiary 13%
- Final examination of 20 year-olds: prof. 70%; baccalaureate 18%; without post-compulsory school examination 11%

#### Pupils and students: total 1'440'000

### **Vocational education and training – basic structure**

- Training in industry and in vocational colleges: dual system
- Offering posts for apprentices according to the labour market; manpower approach: job orientation
- Enabling young adults to master the transition into the working environment



#### **Vocational education - key figures**

- Choice of more than 200 careers in industry, trade, commerce, health care and agriculture
- 2/3 of young adults, over 200'000 people in basic vocational training at one time
  - Over 65'000 70'000 people starting vocational training each year
  - Over 58'000 graduating from basic vocational training every year
  - Over 24'000 graduating from advanced vocational training every year



## 2. Principles of reform 2004 (level of confederation)



#### 2.1 Basic principles of reform 2004

#### Build on an integrated and overall system

- Clear division of competence
- Delegation of responsibility
- Integration of health, social affairs and art



## Differentiation but also mobility, transition and permeability within the educational system

- General education
- Professional: advanced vocational training; tertiary B
- Academic



#### Supply of basic vocational training

 Special offers for weaker candidates ('Berufsattest')

### Development of new qualification procedures

- Promotion of further training focussed on professional aspects
  - Innovation, coordination, transparency, quality development
- Recognition of informal learning on the job



#### **Finances**

- Performance oriented lump sums in favour of the Cantons based on the number of people involved in vocational education
- Contributions for innovation in vocational education and offers of public interest: innovation fund
- Increase in the share of federal finances → 25%



### Finances vocational training 2000, burden sharing

- Private companies and professional organisations
   CHF 4.8 b (estimation)
- Public authorities CHF 2.8 b (2002: CHF 3.4 b)
  - Federal authority 14% → 25% (new target)
    - Performance oriented lump sum
    - 10% for innovation projects
  - Cantons, Communities 72%



#### Cost-benefit of apprenticeship scheme

- Apprentice gross costs Sfr 26'050 per year
- Productive performance estimated Sfr 28150
- Net benefit Sfr 2000 per apprentice, e.i. overall benefit for private business Sfr 385 Mio per year

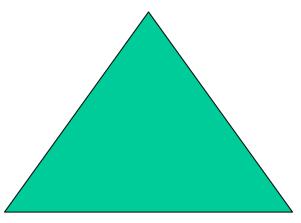

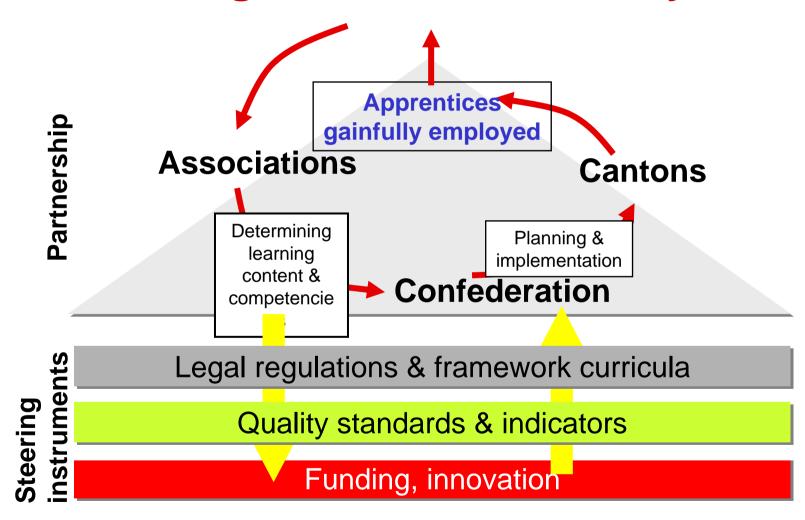


### Professional organisation: curricula and apprenticeships

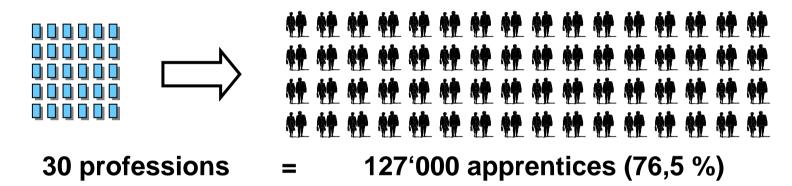


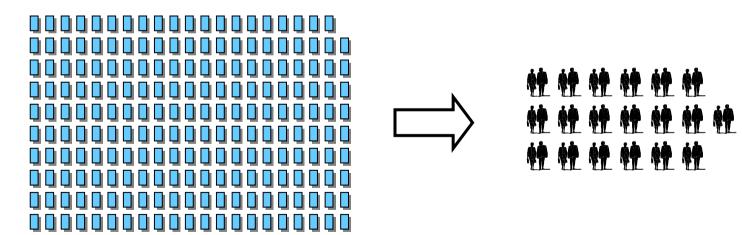

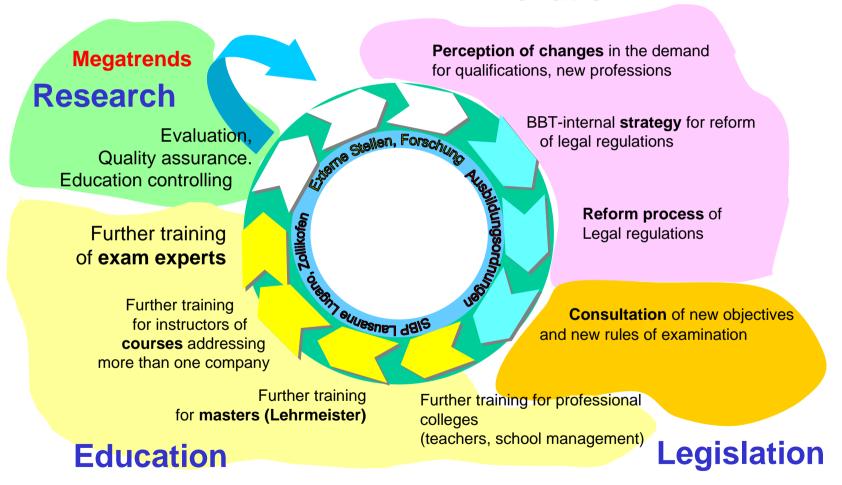
